Cellist Matthew Allen is already establishing himself as one of the leading young American cellists. At the age of 17, Mr. Allen was named by the jury, from 60 cellists up to age 30 representing 24 countries, the Gold Medalist in the Gaspar Cassado International Violoncello Competition in Hachioji, Japan, also winning the highest spectator vote count for the Audience Award.

Born in 1992, the Florida native began studying cello at the age of four with his father. After winning his first competition at the age of 8, he was introduced to the cello professor at Florida State University, the late Lubomir Georgiev. Mr. Georgiev, a prized student of the legendary cellist and teacher Janos Starker, took Mr. Allen on as a student immediately.

He gave his first solo performance with orchestra and solo recital at the age of 11. Embarking on a solo career in his teens with a commanding repertoire of over 20 concerti, Mr. Allen has

been featured with a number of orchestras throughout the United States including the symphonies of Cincinnati, Midland(MI), LaGrange(GA), Tallahassee, Kalamazoo, Asheville(NC), and El Paso.

Concerto performances have also been with the State Hermitage Orchestra of Saint Petersburg in Russia and the Tokyo Philharmonic. The teen cellist has already graced the stages of the world's most prominent venues including the Millennium Stage at Washington D.C.'s Kennedy Center in March 2010, Tokyo's Suntory Hall in July 2010, and most recently, as winner of the 2010 Cleveland Institute of Music's esteemed concerto competition, the Cleveland Orchestra's Severance Hall in April 2011, performing Prokofiev's Sinfonia Concertante.

In addition to his international triumph in Japan, Mr. Allen has been a prizewinner in numerous competitions. Top prizes include 3rd place in the Johansen International Competition, 2nd place in the Irving M. Klein International String Competition, 1st place in the ASTA National Solo Competition, 1st place in the NFMC (National Federation of Music Clubs) Young Artist Award, and the Gold Medal in the Stulberg International String Competition. Also in 2008, Mr. Allen made his international recording debut with David Popper's Hungarian Rhapsody for TELARC Records alongside Erich Kunzel and the Cincinnati Pops, released in August, 2009.

Summer studies have included the Meadowmount School and Pinchas Zukerman's Young Artist Programme in Ottawa, Ravinia's Steans Institute, and Itzhak Perlman's Chamber Music Workshop. Mr. Allen's musical mentors have included Janos Starker, Joel Smirnoff, Michael Tree, Peter Salaff, Alisa Weilerstein, Andres Diaz, Zuill Bailey, David Finckel, Matt Haimovitz, and Steven Isserlis. By audition, Mr. Allen was selected to be the Young Artist Fellow for the Cleveland Orchestra's 2009-2010 season. Mr. Allen currently studies at the Cleveland Institute of Music with Melissa Krauf

Yellow Rose Society to honor Mrs. Brown

Mrs. Glenn L. (Mary Prudie) Brown, president of NFMC from 1987-1991, made an indelible impression on all who knew her, whether as president, student advisor, junior counselor, or Federation friend. She served her fellow man at all levels, from national to the Texas Federation of Music Clubs, to Inspiration Point Fine Arts Colony, and to the Stanton Music Club.

In March 2010, she and Francis Christmann were presented the first Distinguished Service Awards from TFMC at the Lubbock convention. The following month, she slipped into a coma and quietly ended a lifetime marked by highs and lows, but always met with her traditional wit and graciousness.

We in TFMC want to commemorate her service and ensure that she is never forgotten. Therefore, we are organizing The Yellow Rose Society, an endowment to be administered by TFMC, recognizing her preferred title as The Yellow Rose of Texas. We are patterning it after the Rose Fay Thomas Fellows, which began during her presidency in 1989, and also the Florida Fellows and the Prairie Rose Society in North Dakota. All of these offer people the opportunity to support worthwhile musical endeavors.

Membership is open to everyone, not just Texans. Membership fee is \$500, which will entitle the donor to a commemorative medallion and certificate, and recognition at each TFMC convention and in the TFMC directory. Those joining in 2013 will be known as charter members.

When she went out of office in 1991, Mary Prudie designated that her Past National President's award be a biennial \$1,000 educational scholarship to a company member at Inspiration Point Fine Arts Colony in Eureka Springs, Arkansas. The award would go to the winner's college or university to help pay educational expenses.

Unfortunately, the award has shrunk in the intervening years. For one thing, interest rates have decreased. For another, the award has been presented annually rather than biennially, causing it to shrink faster. During her lifetime, Mary Prudie would personally make up the difference between what NFMC could provide and the \$1,000 the winner was to receive. Now that she is gone, there is no one to make up that difference.

Lana Bailey, NFMC chairman of the finance committee, estimates that \$10,000 would shore up the award so that it can be presented annually in the \$1,000 amount originally pledged. TFMC requires that \$7,500 be donated to set up an endowment. We hope to reach these amounts

quickly. The interest will be used to further projects Mary Prudie would endorse. A committee will oversee its management.

TFMC mourns president's loss

TFMC was saddened to learn of the loss December 9 of Louise Whitworth of Austin. Louise served as TFMC president 1987-89 and held many other positions of authority within the Federation. She was a member of the Wednesday Morning Music Club of Austin.

Louise served as recording secretary for the Governing Board of Inspiration Point Fine Arts Colony until illness prevented her from serving. She judged club yearbooks for many years.

Always a woman of class and distinction, she will be missed by her club and friends. Her husband, Lavoy, preceded her in death. She is survived by several daughters and grandchildren.

Another member of the Wednesday Morning Music Club who passed away in December was Bonnie Cummins Fielder, who died December 17, two months shy of her 87th birthday. Her husband, Parker C. Fielder, predeceased her.

In addition to her years as a classroom teacher, Bonnie taught all who knew her the beauty of the classical arts, the importance of world travel, and the joy of getting lost in a good book. Bonnie possessed an amazing intellect, was fiercely

independent and self-reliant, and remained so until her final hours.

A world traveler, Bonnie had an insatiable curiosity about the world and actively investigated cultures and customs different from her own. Eschewing standard package trips as "too touristy," she became adept at exploring the world beyond brochures, and would share wonderful stories about following footpaths on the shores of the Amazon or wandering the back streets of European towns while stepping over the rubble of the Second World War. She started her own company, Cummins World Tours, so she could introduce her passion for world travel to her high school students. Many were the beneficiaries of her custom excursions as Bonnie delighted in introducing them to the magic of mingling with the locals at a neighborhood pub or exploring the wonders of a village market far from the beaten path.

From her earliest years, her greatest love was classical music. She once said that she was probably the only elementary school student in Uvalde, Texas, who couldn't wait to listen to opera on the radio "They really didn't know what to make of me," she chuckled. A dedicat-

ed.and active member of the Wednesday Morning Music Club the Fielder Grant Competition is named in her honor. She was also a generous supporter of many promising vocal students by providing them scholarships, travel and coaching expenses, living quarters, and practical advice about careers and life in general. She loved showcasing their talent at her legendary living room soirees. Bonnie became a maternal surrogate to many of her students with relationships enduring far beyond their college years, and she took great pride in their professional accomplishments.

At Bonnie's request, there was no memorial service. A final celebratory soiree honoring her memory will take place in the spring with many of her beloved students and friends gathering one last time to celebrate the accomplishments of a brilliant woman whose memory we now carry within our hearts.

Clubs with each member giving more than \$ 1.by MARCH 15 will be listed in the OIO Newsletter as 110 % and receive a certificate at Federation Days. States who have 100% or 110% level by MARCH 15 all five years will be listed as "Above and Beyond Clubs" in the May Newsletter, and also receive special recognition at Federation Days.

Procedure for Collecting and handling donations: Each club asks for donations from members during the year or though out the year (Some clubs pay the cor-
